Higuayagua is a community of Pan-Caribbean people of Taíno descent. We are dedicated to preserving the Taíno Culture that persists, as well as rescuing traditions that have disappeared. We consider ourselves to be full blooded Indians of mixed blood! We do not negate our African nor our Spanish ancestry. However, our identities are geographically based and we feel that the contributions from all migrants to the region are important aspects of the historical Native experience. Our work strives to dispel and abolish the "extinction" narrative by demonstrating the plethora of Indigeneity present in the modern Caribbean today.

The display of Taíno cemí (Spiritual Objects) tells Taíno Stories, and provides detailed information on their cultural significance. These objects are made in "Janus mode"; they appear to be singular objects but are in fact multifaceted.

Workshops encourage participants to create a Cemí out of clay, or to make their own versions of it.
